Over the past year, there has been an almost complete lack of member involvement with the HOA on any level. Historically, dues haven't been paid (last year was the highest rate - 60%). The Neighborhood Watch is only a few signs. Firewise has survived because of only one man. Attendance at the annual meeting last year was less than 10%. This last point precluded approval of a budget, establishment of HOA priorities, or even the election of a new Board.

The state of the HOA was a concern to several residents. These neighbors, as well as our new president, volunteered to serve on the Board to ensure the continuation of the HOA, to "protect our neighborhood" and be "involved in neighborhood issues. "The new board wishes to ensure the HOA is operating in accordance with current laws and is financially sound.

We will be happy to spin up committees for those of you who don't have the time to commit to being a Board member but want to see action in Greencrest.


